- Symptoms of a heart attack, including chest pain and shortness of breath
- Symptoms of a stroke, including face droopiness, arm weakness and slurred speech

- Loss of consciousness
- Severe abdominal pain
- Severe allergic reaction
- Uncontrolled bleeding
- Sudden, severe headache
