ENDOSCOPIC CARPAL TUNNEL

Surgery can correct carpal tunnel, a condition caused by pressure to the median nerve within the wrist, or carpal tunnel. You might feel pain, a tingling sensation, numbness of the fingers, weakness or aching. Carpal tunnel syndrome is associated with multiple conditions including: repetitive motion or overuse, fluid retention during pregnancy, injury to the nerve in the carpal tunnel or rheumatoid arthritis.

TRIGGER FINGER


Trigger finger is an abnormal condition in which the tissues surrounding the tendon become inflamed. The affected finger may become momentarily locked in a flexed or bent position followed by a “snapping” sensation when it is straightened back out. Patients may also experience pain and a “clicking” sensation. Corticosteroid injections and hand surgery can help.

TRAUMA SURGERY

This surgery seeks to restore to near normal the function of fingers and hands injured by trauma or to correct abnormalities that were present at birth.

DUPUYTREN'S CONTRACTURE

DuPuytren's Contracture is an abnormal condition that causes the tissues in the palm to thicken. This leads to hard bumps or “nodules” or “bands” under the skin of the palm, joint stiffness and an inability to straighten fingers all the way. Most often the ring finger and pinky are affected. Special injections and/or surgery can be help to correct it.
