

Becoming a Level II Trauma Center ensures life-threatening situations will no longer require being transferred more than an hour outside our hospital system to an existing trauma center.

When responding to trauma cases, a "golden hour for treatment" exists. The majority of trauma deaths happen within the first hour after injury. Structure for rapid treatment significantly impacts patient outcomes. System wide, every two to three days, a trauma patient is received at a Penn Highlands DuBois. These cases are comprised of multi-trauma injuries along with complex orthopedic issues. With the addition of the trauma center to Penn Highlands DuBois, any and all subspecialities can be called upon with immediate availability, including; cardiology, nephrology, pulmonology, obstetrics, gynecology. Penn Highlands DuBois with the addition of the trauma center will treat approximately 300 additional patients per year with trauma injuries. These are patients who otherwise would be transferred out of the system to an existing trauma center if not for creating one here, close to home.

"The trauma center is the entire hospital. It is not just the emergency department. Everything changes with having a trauma center from top to bottom, with every staff member of the hospital. The level of care is upgraded across the board— improvement, elevated, all around. Bringing on resources and changing the way we do things will be reflected across all subspecialties. Once you commit to becoming a trauma center, the entire hospital is involved. It becomes an institutional game changer."

"Keeping people close to home provides quality care without sending the patient to another location. This is based on the idea that preventable trauma deaths generally occur in the first one to two hours. Hemorrhagic shock or traumatic brain injury are the biggest two. They need to be in the right place at the right time. Having a blood bank, operating room and staff immediately available can help preventable trauma deaths."



Varacallo sees a wide variety of patient injuries while also treating athletes in many of the region's school districts including DuBois, Brockway, Brookville, Clearfield and St. Marys. Growing up as an athlete in the area, Dr. Varacallo says he did not have access to the type of care, specifically sports injuries, that athletes here now have available.

"Growing up my brother tore his ACL in high school and had to go to a Pittsburgh hospital for treatment. Advancements in sports medicine for athletes today has vastly changed. Now Penn Highlands has a high volume ACL reconstruction center where today's athletes can get care close to home and not have to travel outside the system hours away. Many procedures done here cannot be found anywhere around our area. We seek better and quicker results. I see patients now from two to three hours away, with some seeking a second opinion by coming here to Penn Highlands."
